Launch of the ACTS AI Institute “Charting the Path Towards an African-Centered AI Future”

The African Centre for Technology Studies (ACTS) is launching the ACTS AI Institute, formerly the Digital Economy Programme. This new strategic direction was approved by the ACTS governing Council in January 2025, and it is directed to position Africa at the forefront of responsible AI innovation, development and adoption.

The ACTS AI Institute comes at an important point in global technological evolution. As AI increasingly shapes economic, social and governance systems worldwide, African nations must develop contextually relevant approaches that harness AI's potential whilst addressing its unique regional challenges. The Institute will serve as a nexus for research, policy development, capacity building and strategic partnerships in the AI domain across Africa.

BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE

For over thirty years, ACTS has been at the forefront of science, technology and innovation policy research in Africa. The Centre has historically structured its work through five programmatic areas: Agriculture, Food Security and Nutrition; Climate Change; Youth, Gender and Inclusive Development; Science, Technology and Innovation Policy; and Digital Economy.

The evolution of the Digital Economy programme into the ACTS AI Institute reflects the growing significance of AI as a transformative force across these domains.

The decision to establish a dedicated institute was informed by several key factors:

1. The rapid advancement of AI technologies globally presents both opportunities and significant challenges for African development. The region requires institutions capable of navigating this complex landscape with contextual understanding and foresight.
2. Various initiatives within the Digital Economy Programme, such as the UK-Kenya AI Challenge, AI4D Scholarship Project, Lacuna fund AMR Project and Facebook AI for Jobs project, has shown the potential for impactful AI applications when developed through partnerships and with attention to local contexts. These initiatives have created momentum that can be amplified through a dedicated institute.
3. There remains a critical gap in Africa-centred research, policy frameworks and implementation guidance for responsible AI development. The ACTS AI Institute will address this gap through rigorous research and practical guidance grounded in African realities.
4. The establishment of the ACTS AI Institute aligns with continental priorities expressed in the African Union's Digital Transformation Strategy and national development plans across Africa that increasingly recognise AI as a strategic domain.

Launch objectives

1. To **create awareness of the ACTS AI Institute** among current and potential stakeholders to position the institute as a thought leader in responsible AI development.
2. **Establish interconnectedness between the AI and the various socio-economic sectors** outlined in AU Agenda 2063, and the global goals 2030 such as health, food, education, infrastructure, agriculture, climate and environment.
3. **Develop and strengthen strategic partnerships to steer the development of responsible AI** innovations on the continent, in line with the continent's aspirations of Science, Technology and Innovation.
